President's Message

Happy Holidays! As we celebrate this holiday, we remind ourselves how thankful we are to have so many friends and supporters of our organization. Local residents, as well as visitors, share our vision of maintaining the historic character of our small town. This is one reason why we are so diligently pursuing the rehabilitation of the 1927 Bank of Everglades Building.

To update you on ESHP, we have recently had some changes. **Kathy Brock**, who served us so well in guiding us through the early phases of our Bank project, has retired from our Board (as well as *The Mullet Rapper*). We would like to acknowledge our appreciation for her time, devotion, and commitment to our organization and projects. Fortunately, one of our other Board members, **Hydie Friend**, has been elected Vice-President to carry on with our goals and objectives. If you're not familiar with Hydie's background and expertise, she is a retired certified city planner and has more than forty years of experience using historic preservation for economic development. She has been recognized by her home state of West Virginia and her hometown of Wheeling for her dedication and commitment to community-led preservation and development efforts. Hydie was an early leader in the National Park Service's National Heritage Area movement. Now a Florida resident, she is applying her energy in supporting the efforts of the Everglades Society for Historic Preservation.

Moving forward on the **Bank of Everglades Building** project, Hydie and I drove to Tallahassee on November 16 to attend and speak to the State Commissioners at the **Division of Historic Resources grants review** meeting. We are very happy to report that our grant received a ranking of 15 out of 36 and a high scoring of 90.667! The request for funds for the grant applications with a scoring of 80 and above will now go to the Secretary of State for approval, then to the Governor's office. This was a small matching grant with a total budget of \$106,000 with a lot more needed, but it is our first grant awarded to this project and a great accomplishment. Also, we made funding appropriations requests to both the State and the Federal governments for assistance with the Bank Building project and await their decision.

The **structural design for the foundation** is near completion, and this will be the most expensive part of the project. It cost over \$1 million to repair the foundation for City Hall in 2006 so we have been advised that it could cost almost twice that in today's market.

We will keep you informed, but your continued membership and support at our fundraisers will be key in finishing this project.
