### LOST BUILDINGS



The old Copeland Prison at 20201 SR-29 opposite Deep Lake was destroyed in September during a controlled burn in accordance with a demolition permit. The facility was established in 1952 and after it closed the parcel was sold several times to a private concerns. When it was operational, inmates worked on supervised day release helping the City with maintenance jobs.

### Who Was Barron Collier?

Our "Welcome-Back Historical Evening" features a presentation about this illustrious and flamboyant founder of our County.



Besides his activities in Florida, which included luxury hotels all over the southern part of the state, he was a big man in New York City during the Roaring Twenties and a generous benefactor to various charitable organizations. He rubbed shoulders with Roosevelts, Rockefellers, and the top brass in Florida. The famous Everglades streetcar came from Luna Park on Coney Island in which Collier was an owner.

And, his sons Sam and Miles were avid auto racers in upstate New York who had a green car called the "Ardent Alligator".
